
A SERVICE OF THANKSGIVING AT THE NEW YEAR


Choir: To Thee, O Lord.

Choir: (Repeats 'God is the Lord...')









The Epistle Reading


Priest: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

Priest: Wisdom!

Reader: The reading from the first Epistle of the holy Apostle Paul to Timothy.

Priest: Let us attend!

(1 Timothy 2: 1-7)

Reader: MY SON TIMOTHY: First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all men, for kings and all who are in high positions, that we may lead a quiet and peaceful life, godly and respectful in every way. This is good, and it is acceptable in the sight of God our Savior, who desires all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth.

For there is one God, and there is one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus, who gave himself as a ransom for all, the testimony to which was born at the proper time. For this I was appointed a preacher and apostle (I am telling the truth, I am not lying), a teacher of the Gentiles in faith and truth.

Priest: Peace be unto you reader.

The Gospel Reading

Priest: Wisdom! Let us attend. Let us listen to the Holy Gospel. Peace be unto all.
Choir: And to Thy spirit.
Priest: The reading from the Holy Gospel according to Saint Luke.
Choir: Glory to Thee, O Lord, glory to Thee.
Priest: Let us attend!
(Luke 4: 16-22)

AT THAT TIME, Jesus came to Nazareth, where He has been brought up; and He went to the synagogue, as His custom was, on the Sabbath day. And He stood up to read; and there was given to Him the book of the prophet Isaiah.

He opened the book and found the place where it was written, "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to preach good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovering sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed, to proclaim the acceptable year of the Lord."

And He closed the book, and gave it back to the attendant, and sat down; and the eyes of all in the synagogue were fixed on Him. And He began to say to them, "Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing." And all spoke well of Him, and wondered at the gracious words which proceeded out of His mouth.

The Augmented Litany

Choir: Lord, have mercy (3x).

Priest: We, Thine unprofitable servants, give thanks to Thee with fear and trembling, O Lord, our Savior and Master, for Thou hast poured Thy blessings upon us abundantly. We fall down in worship before Thy loving mercy and praise Thee as our God, fervently crying to Thee: deliver Thy servants from all calamities, and in Thy mercy, grant all our requests which are unto salvation; we beg Thee, Lord, hear us and have mercy.

Choir: Lord, have mercy (3x).

Priest: That Thou wilt bless the crown of the coming year with Thy bounty, and quench the flames of discord, enmity and strife; that Thou wilt give us peace, perseverance, sincere love, and a virtuous disposition; we beg Thee, Lord, hear us and have mercy.

Choir: Lord, have mercy (3x).

Priest: That Thou will not call to mind the innumerable sins we have committed during the past year, and wilt not deal with us as our evil lives deserve, but that Thou wilt remember us in Thy mercy and bounty; we beg Thee, Lord of mercy and tender compassion, hear us and have mercy.

Choir: Lord, have mercy (3x).

Priest: That Thou wilt give rain in due season, both the early and the latter rains, gentle showers, temperate and healthful breezes, and wilt illumine us with the warmth of the sun; we beg Thee, O all-bountiful Lord, hear us and have mercy.

Choir: Lord, have mercy (3x).

Priest: That Thou wilt remember Thy Holy Church, and strengthen and establish it, enlarge it and give it peace, preserving it forever unscathed by the gates of hell and impregnable against all the assaults of visible and invisible enemies; beg Thee, O all-powerful Lord, hear us and have mercy.

Choir: Lord, have mercy (3x).

Priest: That Thou wilt root out and destroy every blasphemous design of the unbelieving world, and hasten the day when the meek will inherit the earth; we beg Thee, O all-powerful Lord hear us and have mercy.

Choir: Lord, have mercy (3x).

Priest: That Thou wilt deliver us throughout the coming year, and all the days of our life, from famine, flood, epidemic, hail, fire, the sword, the invasion of enemies, and from civil war, from sudden and unprovided death, from sickness, calamity, and distress, from faithlessness and hard-heartedness, and from grievous temptations; we beg Thee, O tenderly-compassionate Lord, hear us and have mercy.

Priest: Again and again on bended knees, let us pray to the Lord. *Choir:* Lord, have mercy.



(*Then the priest exclaims in a loud voice*): *Priest*: Glory to Thee, O God our Savior, unto ages of ages. *Choir:* Amen.


